Coral4Health also featured in the presentations/introduction decks sent to potential strategic partners such as Stryker and Johnson & Johnson.

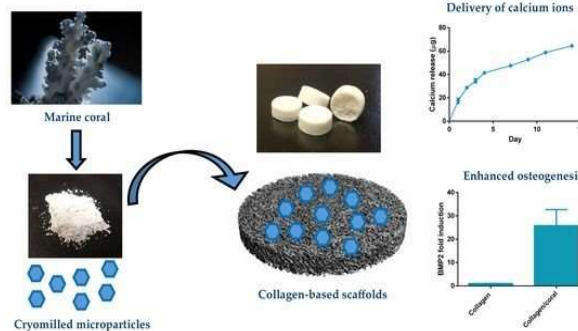
